Marvellous Maths

Our focus this term:

Number: We will focus on finding one more and one less, counting out amounts and subitising. We will be developing a deep understanding of numbers to 5. We will also practise writing numbers and representing combinations of amounts.

Measure: We will learn about comparing and ordering objects by weight, length, height and capacity.

Shape: We will name and describe 2d and 3d shapes. We will recognise and continue repeating patterns.
