

This term we are continuing to take a reading approach to our curriculum and we will be focusing our topic work around three key texts. Man on the Moon: a day in the life of Bob by Simon Bartram, The Darkest Dark by Chris Hadfield and The Marvellous Moon Map by Teresa Heapy. We

will be exploring the history of space and travel and looking at what it would be like to live in space. In art we will be creating our own alien sculptures and we will be using a range of media to create a space scene.

<u>Maths</u>

We will begin with building on our knowledge of addition using the expanded column method. Then we will work on our knowledge of



money and link this to our first book: Man on the Moon. We will be exploring different combinations of coins that make the same amount and we will use the expanded column method to find the total when buying 2 items from Bob's Space Souvenir Shop. We will also look at using our skills to answer and explain our answers to a range of problems.

<u>Science</u>

In Science we will explore animals including humans. We will explore the basic needs of animals, changes and growth, offspring and we will also look at health and hygiene. We will be carrying out investigations and enquiries to broaden our knowledge and understanding.
