We will end with looking at the place where we live and comparing it to the other places that we have learned about.

<u>Maths</u>

This is what we will be focussing on in maths this term: Measure: comparing capacity, mass, height and length Number: composition of the numbers 6,7,8,9 and 10 One more and less, making pairs and addition Time: days of the week, sequencing events and measuring time Shape: 3d shapes and creating patterns.

<u>Phonics</u>

This term we will be learning phase 3 sounds such as ow, ar and ai. We call these digraphs. They are two letters that make one sound. Please support your child and practise these at home. We will continue to consolidate the sounds we have learnt so far and use this knowledge to read and write simple words and sentences.

We will also be learning to read and write some tricky words such as my, by, all, was, you, they.

We will continue to send home the new sounds each week as well as putting a supporting post on Tapestry.
