Our Topic this term is

Footprints!

The footprints that we are going to follow are dinosaur footprints as the children have shown a great interest in dinosaurs.

Each week we will read a dinosaur story and use it for the starting point for our learning. We will use our investigation skills to find out lots of facts about different dinosaurs by using information books, search engines and fact finding programs. We will end the term learning dinosaur poems and creating our own.

Fantastic Phonics

This term we be consolidating phase 3 digraphs and trigraphs we learnt last term such as ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, ar, or, ur, ow, oi and ear.

We will be blending sounds to read and segmenting (breaking words into sounds) words to spell and will focus on longer words that have digraphs an double letters. We will be supporting the children to read and write sentences.

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Marvellous Maths

Our focus this term:

Ordinal numbers such as 1st, 2nd, 3rd
Knowing that the final count is the total
Comparing groups of objects

and knowing that a total number can be made in different ways.

Please support this learning at home too.

The Forest!

We like to take our learning outside into our forest area. We will be doing lots of investigation, drama, talking and developing our own learning pathways. And most importantly getting a bit muddy!

Please ensure your child has a named pair of wellies that can stay at school.

Home Reading - Reading crowns!

The school's expectation is that children read to a grown up 4 times within a week and that this is noted in the reading record book.
