We will also be using lots of non-fiction books to find out information and learning new songs and rhymes

Speaking and listening

This term we will be listening to longer stories and recalling what happens in them in order We will be asking lots of "how" and "why" questions and using the FANTASTICS to develop vocabulary to answer them.

Phonics and Literacy

This term we will develop our skills in hearing and clapping the syllables in words. We will continue to blend the sounds we hear together to make a word and identify words which start with the same sounds. We will be working hard on our pencil control and name writing skills and writing independently in our play. We will be making a minibeast diary, keeping lists of which mini-beasts we find.

Our Jigsaw PSHE work is all about relationships, we will cover families and friendships.
