Coastguard Visit

On Tuesday we had a visit from the Coastguard team who talked to the children about beach safety and their role in keeping people safe and overseeing the shoreline. This involved Mr Atkin taking part in a demonstration where he was a casualty and was securely wrapped up on a flexible stretcher to be transported safely to hospital. Mrs Paulson and Mrs Bell were equipped in the Coastguard uniform to show children what they wear, why and how the different equipment is used. The children also had the opportunity to sit in the Coastguards purpose built four by four truck and sound the siren. The children experienced the Coastguard getting a real life 'call-out' which meant they had to leave quickly to attend a situation at the beach. All children were given a 'sea smart' beach activity pack which we hope parent/carers all find useful in helping to keep your child safe at the seaside.

Warmer Weather
