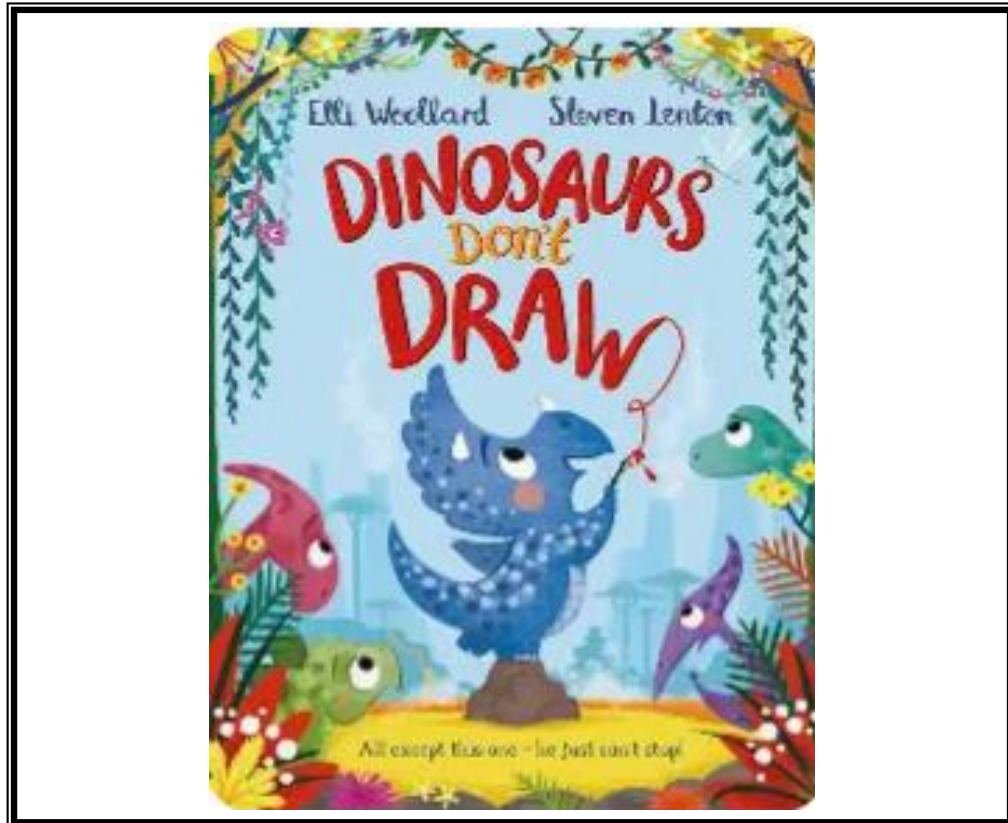

Class 1's Recommended Read

Dinosaurs Don't Draw



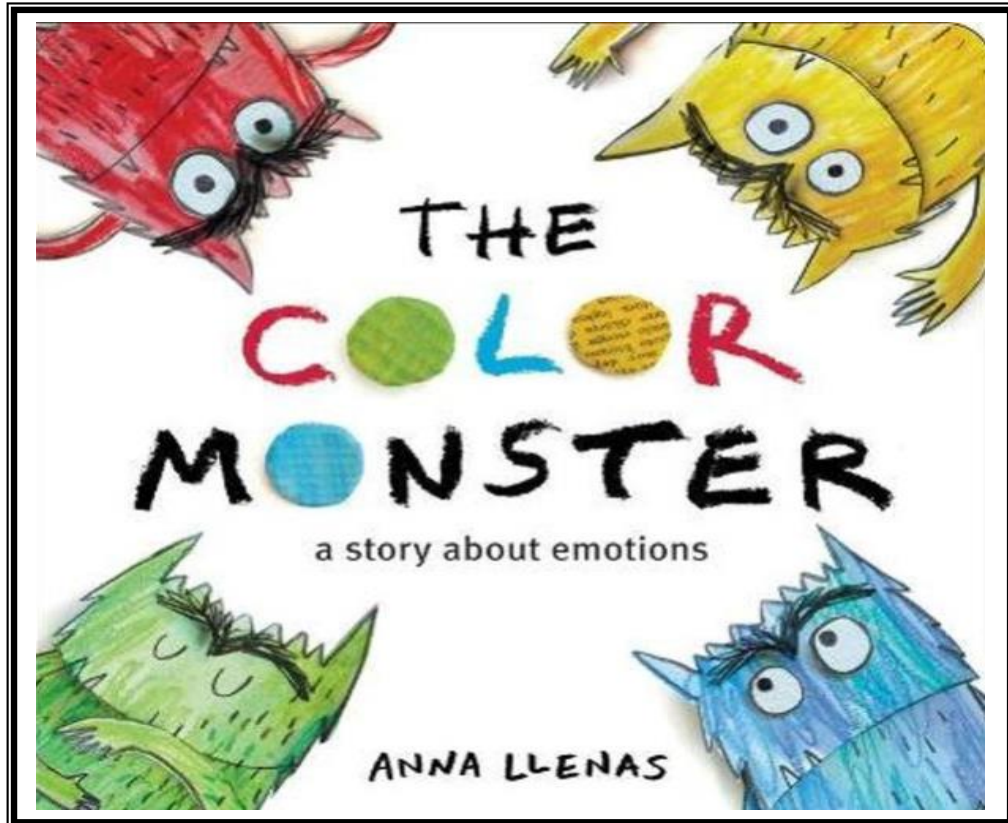

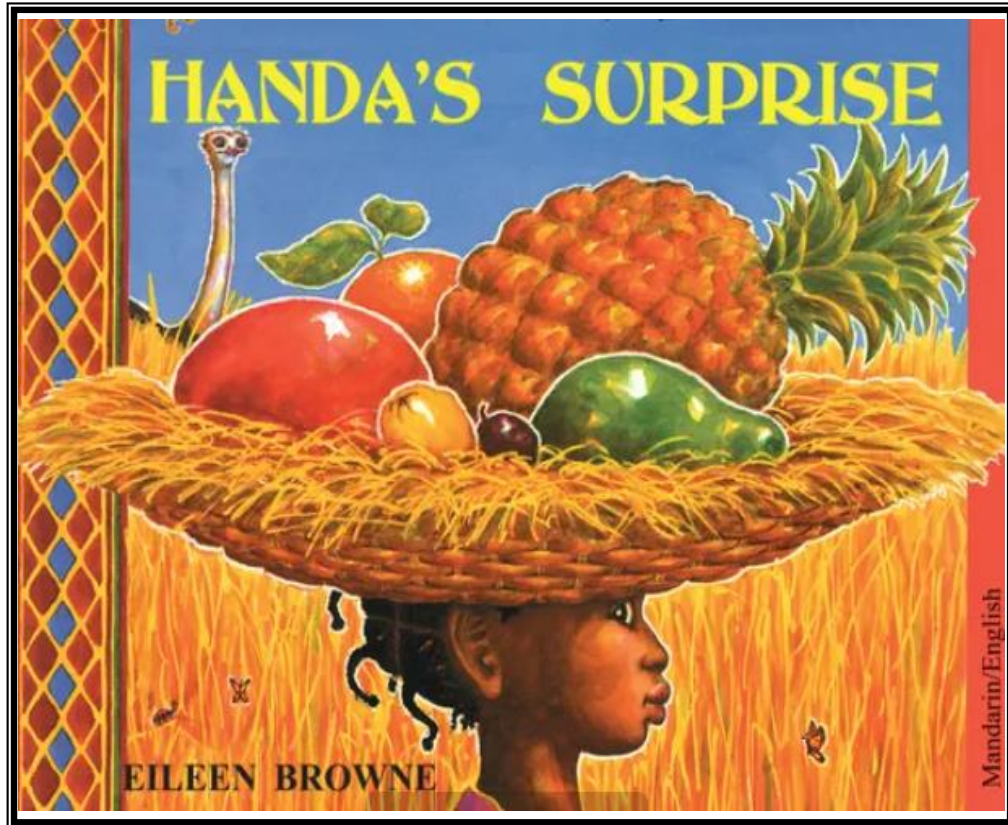

Handa's Surprise by Eileen Brown



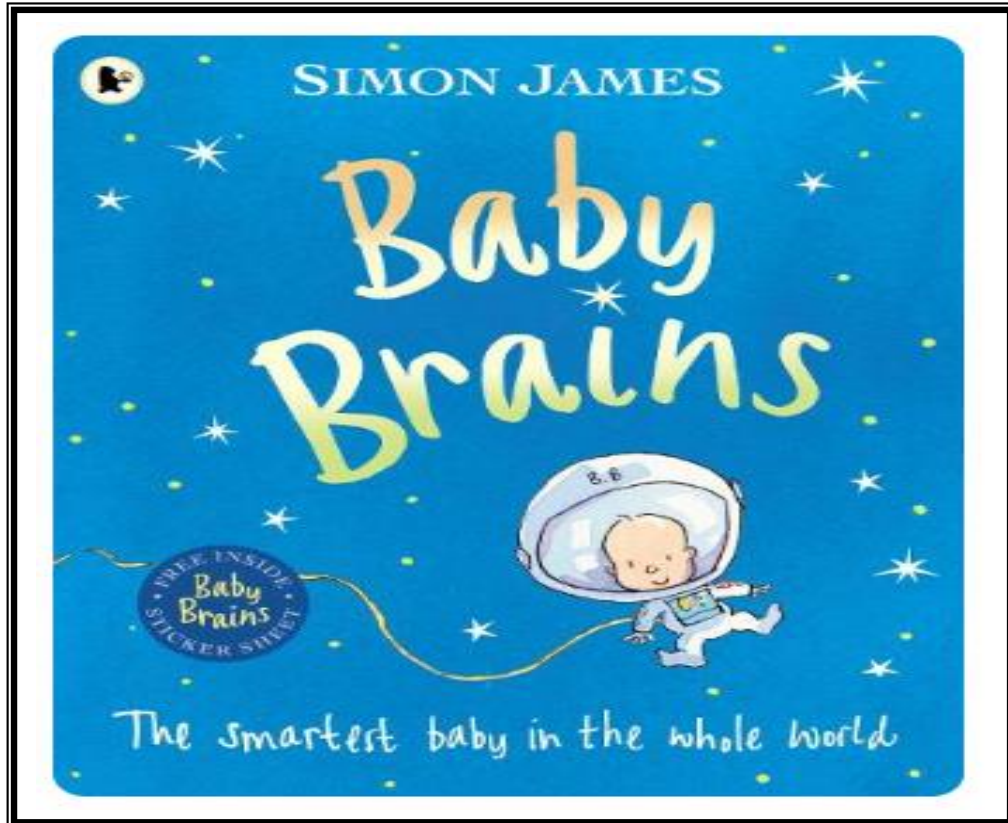
This book is about a girl finding fruit. She takes the fruit to her friend as a surprise and comes across lots of animals on the way.

Baby Brains by Simon James



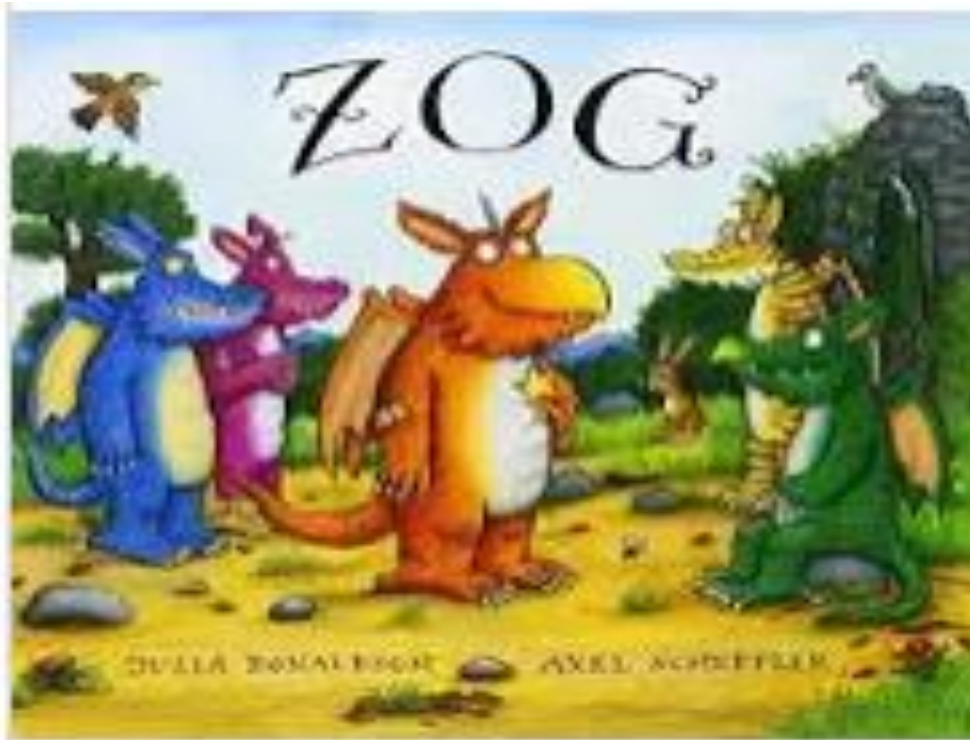

Zog by Julia Donaldson

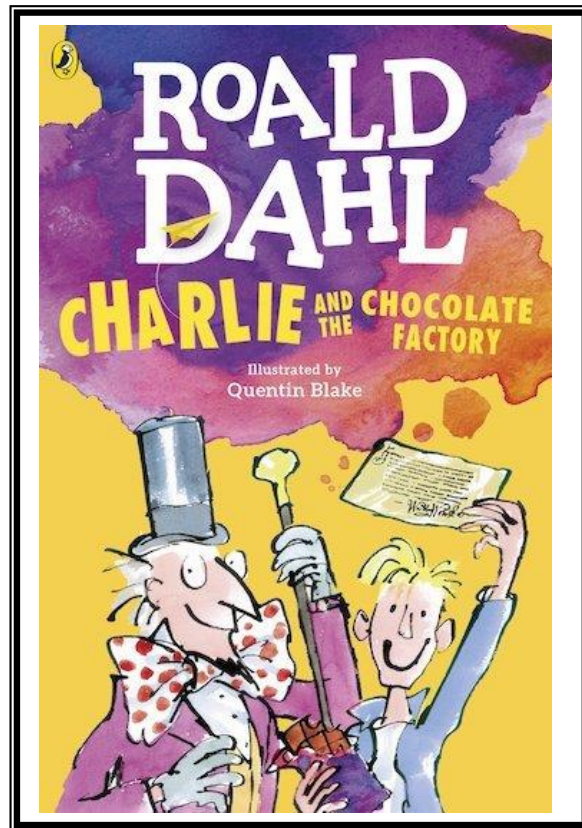

Charlie and the Chocolate Factory by Roald Dahl



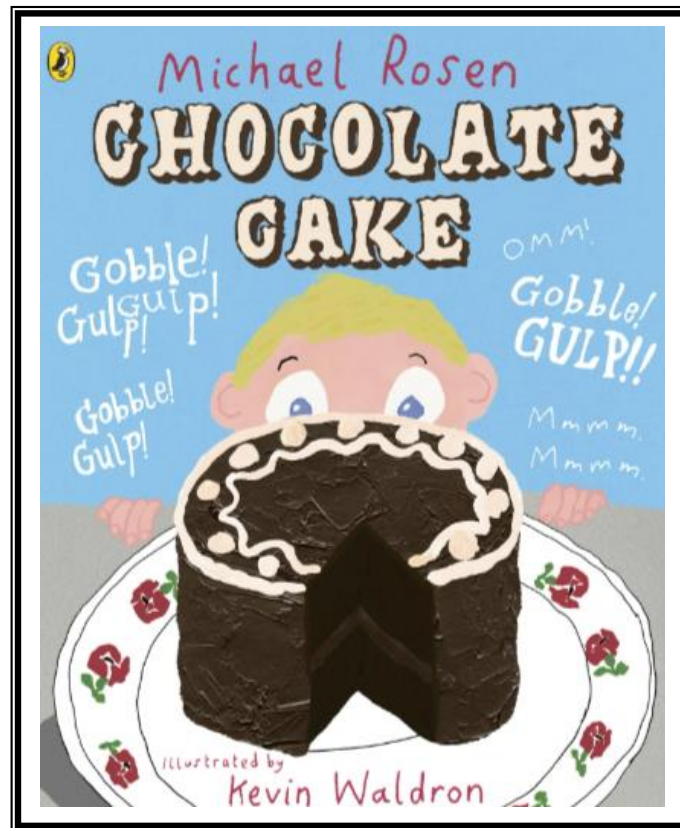
